


- 1) The Van Meter City Council met for a special work session with the Van Meter School Board on Monday, August 13, 2018 at the Veterans Reception Center. Mayor Allan Adams called the meeting to order at 6:03 PM. The following council members were present upon roll call: Kim Sacker, Adam Coyle, Joe Herman, Lyn Lyon, and Steve Meyer

Staff present: City Administrator Kyle Michel

The Van Meter School Board was present in its entirety as well as Superintendent Durflinger.

- 2) Mayor Adams asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Coyle moved supported by Lyon to approve the agenda. Motion passed unanimously.
- 3) Introductions were made.
- 4) The joint work session was opened by Superintendent Durflinger. Durflinger gave a brief review of past planning efforts between the City and School District and outlined some potential opportunities for partnership efforts in the future. Discussion ensued regarding the needs of the school district in regard to facilities and expansion plans. Information was provided for various Knapp Properties developments within Van Meter and the School District. City Administrator Michel provided an update on the planning efforts for the relocation of the joint public safety and library building. Discussion ensued regarding the potential for expanding the project to include a multiuse structure. Superintendent Durflinger pointed out the need for preschool and before and after school care in Van Meter and the potential for a partnership between the School and City to meet the needs of residents. Discussion shifted to the proposed amendment of the 28E agreement between the City and School for a School Resource Officer. Councilman Meyer expressed that the public safety committee was working with Public Safety Director Daggett to review the 28E agreement and address necessary changes for expanding the services provided by the Van Meter Police Department.
- 5) No other reports or non-action items came before the boards for discussion.
- 6) Mayor Adams asked for a motion to adjourn. Coyle moved supported by Lyon. Passed unanimously.
